About TIAS



About the University of Tsukuba

The University of Tsukuba was established in 1973 in Tsukuba Science City, 45 minutes from Tokyo.

- 9 undergraduate schools including Health & Physical Education & Art & Design
- 7 doctoral degree programmes
- 11 laboratory schools including 5 special needs schools
- 3 Nobel Prize Winners (Physics & Chemistry)
- 7 Olympic champions (Gymnastics & Judo)

Faculty of Health and Sport Sciences (School of Health & Physical Education)

- 1,000 undergraduate students, 300 master's degree course students, & 150 students on doctoral degree courses in sport sciences & coaching
- 120 professors & 20 assistants
- courses in 40 areas of sport science, including humanities, pedagogy, coaching & health sciences

The University of Tsukuba has a history of involvement in the Japanese Olympic Movement stretching back over 100 years, longer than that of any other university. Constantly in contact with the IOC & other international sporting bodies, the University has been a driving force in Japanese sport & 2014 sees the beginning of a new chapter in its history.

Centre for Olympic Research and Education (CORE)

In December 2010, CORE was established to celebrate Jigoro Kano's 150th birth anniversary. CORE inherits the sports history of the University of Tsukuba and promotes the practice and development of Olympic education and research, authorised by the IOC. There are 31 such institutions in the world, this is the first in Japan. CORE will cooperate with 11 related institutes such as special support education schools and affiliated schools.



About Jigoro Kano




Dr Jigoro Kano (1860-1938) was the founder of Kodokan Judo. He served for 25 years as principal of Tokyo Higher Normal School, forerunner of the University of Tsukuba. He devoted himself to educational reform, the development of physical education and sport, and the promotion of the Olympic Movement. His philosophy of 'maximum efficient use of energy' and 'prosperity for self and others' and his achievements would provide guidance for us after the Great East Japan Earthquake of 2011. This spirit still guides our actions today.

'Nothing under the sun is greater than education' (一世化育)




