Citizens of six Eastern Partnership states: Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Moldova and Ukraine may attend a two-year Master's degree studies course in disciplines such as: science, technology, economy and European studies/European law. The Programme is addressed to citizens who meet the following conditions:

- have completed university studies not earlier than 3 years ago with a diploma in science, natural sciences, technical sciences, economics and European studies/law
- or are in the last year of their university studies (Bachelor's or Master's degree) when submitting the application;
- possess knowledge of the Polish language at a level that enables them to study in Poland.

The Program includes:

- Courses at selected faculty, under conditions for foreigners and in accordance with the rules effective at the respective university;
- Opportunity to complete a month-long course in Polish, including knowledge of Poland and cultural and integration activities;
- Chance to take part in a student exchange under the EU Erasmus Programme, after the completion of the first year of studies;
- · Opportunity to participate in a short-term professional internship in Poland.

As a result of the first recruitment procedure for the academic year 2013/2014, 43 recipients of the Scholarship are currently studying at Polish universities, including the Jagiellonian University in Krakow, the University of Warsaw, as well as in Poznań, Wrocław or Lublin. Students receive scholarship grants and study free of charge.
